



**I Am David (2004)**  
(90 minutes)

**Story:** Adapted from Anne Holm's internationally acclaimed novel "North to Freedom", this is the story of 12-year-old David (Ben Tibber), who escapes a post-World War II concentration camp with little more than a compass, a sealed letter, a loaf of bread, and instructions to carry the letter to authorities in Denmark.

Having been raised almost his entire life in the camp, David knows only the harsh and brutal side of humanity. More than a journey to Denmark, his is a journey to discover who he is and whether the world outside the fence is any safer and kinder than the world inside the fence.

There are several mysteries you will need to solve as you take the journey with David. You may enjoy it even more the second time you watch it.
